New Building Doubles Production Space

This year started out strong for dB Control. In the first quarter of 2008, we landed multiple production contracts worth \$8 million from major U.S. defense contractors supplying the U.S. Army, Navy and Air Force. Our high-power traveling wave tube (TWT) amplifiers and microwave power modules (MPMs) will be integrated into radar, electronic countermeasure (ECM) systems and data links aboard ships and high-altitude manned and unmanned aircraft. With so much to design, build and test, it was time to expand our

manufacturing capacity. Timing was perfect as the adjacent building became available. After months of planning, walls came down and construction began. We've now doubled our total floor space from 25,500 to 40,000 square feet with a new facility that's custom designed for high-volume production.
